

Dr. Sam George teaches global migration, diaspora mission, and World Christianity at five seminaries across Asia, Africa, and the Americas. He is a faculty and director of the Global Diaspora Institute of Wheaton College and lives with his family in the northern suburbs of Chicago. He holds degrees in Mechanical Engineering, Business Management, Missiology, and Theology. He is of Asian-Indian origin and St. Thomas Christian heritage of Kerala, India, and has lived and worked in five countries and continues to travel widely as the global catalyst of the Lausanne Movement. Sam is the founder-director of Parivar International (based in the US) and Urban India Ministries (based in India). He has authored/edited a dozen books, including the recent three-volume series on *Asian Diaspora Christianity*.

Jenny Yang is the Senior Vice President of Advocacy and Policy at World Relief, where she provides oversight for all advocacy initiatives and policy positions at World Relief. She has worked in the Resettlement section of World Relief as the Senior Case Manager and East Asia Program Officer, where she focused on advocacy for refugees in the East Asia region and managed the entire refugee caseload for World Relief. She is co-author of *Welcoming the Stranger: Justice, Compassion and Truth in the Immigration Debate*, served as co-chair of the Refugee Council USA (RCUSA) advocacy committee, and was named one of the “50 Women to Watch” by Christianity Today.
